1. INTRODUCTION

Born in 1888 in Manchester, Britain, Donald Cameron was the eldest son of Captain Cyril St Clair Cameron, 9th Lancers, British Army. Donald Cameron was brought up in a family with a strong military tradition. He was educated at Winchester College and then the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst. His military career was to follow the pattern established by his father of service with the British Army then returning to Tasmania to manage the family's pastoral enterprises and subsequent service with the Australian Army.

Donald Cameron was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant with the Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders in May 1908 and promoted to Lieutenant three years later in September 1911. In November 1912 he visited Tasmania and his family's property Fordon near Evandale. Two years later in June 1914 he married Cecilia Bolitho, youngest daughter of Captain E. A. Bolitho RN.

Mobilised with the Cameron Highlanders in August 1914 he landed in France at the beginning of World War One. In October that year he was severely wounded in action near Ypres and invalided to hospital in Cambridge, England. For his actions he was awarded the Military Cross and was amongst those in the first list of recipients for this new award which was published on January 1st 1915. His promotion to Captain was confirmed the following month.

In November 1915 he was appointed an instructor in machine gunnery and later promoted to Major. He continued in this role, serving in both Britain and France until August 1917. From September that year he served as a General Staff Officer at the War Office, London and then Assistant Adjutant-General at the British Army in France's Headquarters until March 1919.

He retired from the Cameron Highlanders in 1923 and took up residence at the family property Kelvin Grove near Conara, Tasmania. In 1930 he was commissioned as a Major in the Australian Army and Commanding Officer of "A" Squadron, 3rd (Tasmanian Mounted Infantry) Light Horse Regiment. Five years later he was promoted to Lieutenant Colonel and Commanding Officer of his regiment now the 22nd (Tasmanian Mounted Infantry) Light Horse, a position he held until retiring in 1938.

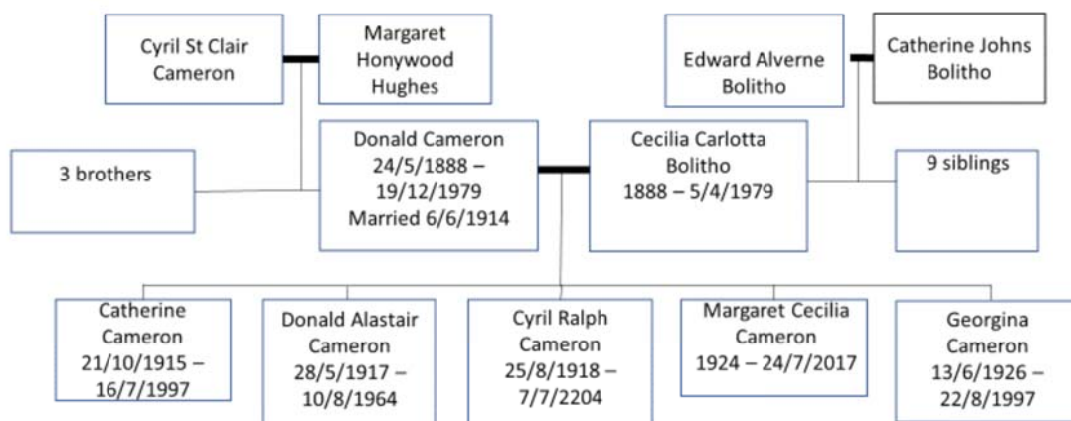
In 1934 he was appointed ADC to the Governor of Tasmania, Sir Ernest Clark and continued in this role until 1940 when he was appointed GSO 1, Tasmanian Forces. He served in this role until June 1943 when he was appointed Commander, Volunteer Defence Corps, Tasmania. In 1944 he was awarded an OBE in the Commonwealth List of New Year Honours and in 1946 he was discharged from the Volunteer Defence Corps as

Commander VDC and Hobart Fortress L of C Area.

Donald Cameron had five children, three daughters and two sons, both sons were to be awarded the Military Cross in World War 2.

Donald Cameron died at the family property Fordon, Nile in 1979.

1914 (October) Lieutenant Donald Cameron of the Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders severely wounded in action near Ypres and invalided to hospital in Cambridge (Daily Telegraph 31/10/1914, Examiner 28/11/1914)

1914 (October) Mentioned in Despatches for his actions under fire.

1914 (December) Promoted to temporary Captain, Cameron Highlanders, (The Mercury 12/12/1933).

1915 (1st January) Lieutenant Donald Cameron awarded the Military Cross included in the first list of recipients of new decoration (Daily Telegraph 8/03/1915)

1915 (February) Promotion to Captain in Cameron Highlanders confirmed, (The Mercury 12/12/1933).

1915 (November) Appointed instructor in machine gunnery and continued in this position until June 1917, (The Mercury 12/12/1933).

1916 Temporary rank of Major in Cameron Highlanders granted, (The Mercury 12/12/1933).

1917 (June – August) Instructor School of Musketry at Hythe and with British Army in France, (The Mercury 12/12/1933).

1917 (August) Major Cameron who was invalided to England as a result of a wound and a gas attack has returned to duty with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel in charge of a machine gun corps (Daily Telegraph, Daily Post 9/08/1917)

1917 (September – April 1918) Temporarily General Staff Officer at the War Office, (The Mercury 12/12/1933).

1918 (June – March 1919) Deputy Assistant Adjutant-General at General Headquarters of the British Army in France, (The Mercury 12/12/1933).

1920 (15th December) Major Cameron unveiled the Nile State School honour roll, while on visit to his parents with his wife (Daily Telegraph 20/12/1920)

1923 (July) Retired from Cameron Highlanders (Advocate 31/08/1937)

1923? Returned to Tasmania

1924 (29th March) Major and Mrs. Donald Cameron attended a garden party at Government House (Examiner 29/03/1924)

1930 (1st January) commissioned as major in the Australian Military Forces and

Commanding Officer of "A" Squadron, 3rd (Tasmanian Mounted Infantry) Light Horse Regiment, (The Mercury 12/12/1933).

1930 (27th May) Major D Cameron, Warden, Evandale at celebration of Empire Day at Evandale Primary School (Examiner 28/05/1930)

1933 (April) Major Donald Cameron and his daughter Catherine of Kelvin Grove Conara Junction left Melbourne "for abroad" (Advocate 6/04/1933)

1933 (5th December) Promoted to Lieutenant Colonel and appointed commanding officer of his regiment then the 22nd Light Horse (Tasmanian Mounted Infantry) a position he continued in until retiring in 1938 (The Mercury 21/12/1933)

1934 (February) Appointed ADC to Governor of Tasmania Sir Ernest Clark from 1934 until 1940 (Examiner 20/02/1934)

1934 (7th March) As ADC attended Vice-Regal Ball at Government House (The Mercury 8/03/1934)

1935 (5th April) The Governor, Sir Ernest Clark accompanied by Lieutenant Colonel Donald Cameron ADC attended the Pioneers Ball at the Albert Hall, Launceston (Examiner 6/04/1935)

1935 (3rd August) Lieutenant Colonel Donald Cameron attended the annual reunion dinner of the 3rd Light Horse Regiment at Heathorn's Hotel, Hobart (The Mercury 6/08/1935)

1936 (28th January) Lieutenant-Colonel Donald Cameron ADC represented the Governor at memorial service at St John's Anglican Church on the death of King Edward 7th, (The Examiner 28/01/1935)

1936 (25th April) Lieutenant Colonel Donald Cameron represented the Governor at the ANZAC Day parade in Launceston which was under the charge of Major-General Sir John Gellibrand (The Examiner, The Mercury 27/04/1936)

1936 (22nd August) Col Donald Cameron accompanied the Governor when he opened the War Veteran's Home at the ANZAC Hostel, Launceston, believed to be the first of its kind in Australia (The Mercury 24/08/1936)

1937 (3rd March) Lieutenant Colonel Donald Cameron (Commanding Officer of the 22nd Light Horse Regiment) and Mrs. Cameron attended Barracks Dance in Launceston (Examiner 3/03/1937)

1937 (12th May) Lieutenant Colonel Donald Cameron MC award of coronation medal for their majesties King George VI and Queen Elizabeth (Examiner 12/05/1937)

1938 (5th March) 22nd Light Horse Regiment 8 days in camp at Mona Vale under command of Lieutenant Colonel Donald Cameron (Advocate

1938 (12th November) The Governor attended by Lt-Colonel Donald Cameron took the Royal Salute of the 12/50th Battalion at Cornwall Square, (Examiner 14/11/1938)

1942 Appointed Honorary ADC to Governor General from 1942 until 1945

1943 (June) Lt-Col Donald Cameron appointed Commander Volunteer Defence Corps, Tasmania, (The Mercury and Examiner 6/07/1943, Advocate 1/01/1944))

1943 Commanded the Hobart Fortress

1944 (1st January) Lieutenant Colonel Donald Cameron awarded OBE in the Commonwealth list of New Year Honours, (Advocate, Examiner 1/01/1944)
